


A BRIEF HISTORY OF HEALTHY SEMINARIANS - HEALTHY CHURCH

| 2012 | HSHC was born! Read about our history, mission, vision, and values. |
| 2013 | First "Moving In Wholeness" small group held at Columbia Theological Seminary (CTS) . |
| 2014 | Established as a 501(c)(3) and validated ministry of Trinity Presbytery (SC) . |
| 2015 | Launched our first Lenten Challenge: Team "Fruit & Vegetable Tracking" Challenge! Conducted a "Healthy Cleaning Matters" seminar at CTS. |
| 2016 | Partnered with the CTS Library to improve healthy practices. "Kick the Can" Lenten Challenge. |
| 2017 | Presented at the Seminary Stewardship Alliance National Conference. Cooking Demos featured on Atlanta's Interfaith Broadcast. Created partnership between CTS and Global Growers Network , expanding garden space to include refugee families. Co-presented with the CTS Library director at the ATLA 71st Annual Conference. |
| 2018 | Received Presbyterian Women's Thank Offering Grant for our "Feed My People" joint project with Columbia Presbyterian Church (Decatur) and Global Grower's Network. |
| 2018 (cont.) | Received Wabash Grant for "Exercising Our Faith" joint project with CTS. Anna Grace Claunch became first HSHC student intern. |
| 2019 | Workshops presented at "The Cura Animarum: Care of Souls" National Conference and the Association for Clinical Pastoral Education Regional Conference. |
| 2019 (cont.) | Nominated the late Natalie (Lee) Phippen who was honored with the "William Gibson Eco-Justice Award" by Presbyterians for Earth Care. |
| 2020 | Moved the majority of programming online to continue to expand our work (even during COVID!) Lucas Mburu became first international student intern. |
| 2020 (cont.) | Expanded "Moving in Wholeness" small groups to include students from multiple seminaries. Maggie Burgess became HSHC's first part-time project consultant. |
| 2021 | Moved to Murrysville, PA! Travis Webster (HSHC co-founder) begins as the associate pastor at Newlonsburg Presbyterian Church. |
| 2022 | Participated in "Labor & Liturgy" gathering during Earth Week celebrations at CTS garden. Travis successfully defended his dissertation, "Does It Have To Make You Sick: Preparing Seminarians For Greater Vocational Health" and graduates with a doctoral degree in pastoral counseling! |
